**Sub: Application for letter of permission and increase of UG Seats from 60 to 100 seats for functioning of Arpit Homoeopathic Medical College, Rajkot-Morbi Highway, Hadala, Taluka; Tankara, District: Rajkot, Gujarat for the academic year 2025-26 under section -28 and 29 of NCH Act 2020- regd.**

Sir,

Arpit Homoeopathic Medical College, Rajkot, Gujarat is functional since 2024 and has applied for permission for sanction of BHMS course with 60 seats and increase of UG Seats from 60 to 100 seats for the academic year 2025-26. The College has submitted the Part I information in which the entire functional profile has been narrated. MARBH conducted Inspection on 11.06.2025 & 12.06.2025, followed by virtual visitation on 26.06.2025 and physical hearing on 27.06.2025. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board has examined the College as to whether the college fulfils the Minimum Essential Standards as per the prevailing regulations under clauses 26, 28 and 29 of the NCH Act 2020. On careful examination of the report, the Medical Assessment and Rating Board observed the following shortfalls: -

1. **Teaching faculty.**

- Department of Human Anatomy: One Professor is not available.
- Department of Homoeopathic Materia Medica: One Professor is not available.
- Department of Repertory and Case taking: One Professor and one associate professor are not available.

As evident from the above statement, a total number of four teachers are deficient against the requirement of 30+1 for 60 seats UG college (As specified in MES,2024) established in 2024. Pursuant to F.No. :3-2/MARBH/NCH/2025-26/162-169 dtd. 16/04/2025 issued by MARBH, a college can avail 15% relaxation against the required number of teachers for Academic Year 2025-26 only. After allowing relaxation of 15%, college has no deficiency in teaching staff. Although such a relaxed number of teachers should also be appointed at the earliest for smooth conduct of course.

However on virtual visitation Principal stated that 18 Teaching faculty are present but only 08 teachers were physically verified. This raises serious concern over the genuine presence of teacher in the college. Teaching Staff were unaware about the fundamentals of CBCD. Few were not knowing even the full form of CBCD. Unavailability of teachers during virtual visitation and total unawareness about the new curriculum clearly indicate that the academics activities in college are highly compromised.

2. **Hospital Functionality:**

- The average number of patients in OPD per day (300 days) is 255 /day against the requirement of 300 /day as per MES 2024.
- Bed Occupancy in % (P X 100 / 365 X B)- 33.98 % which is less than the requirement of 50% as per MES 2024. It is observed to be exaggerated also.
- Records mentioned "Arpit Ayurveda hospital and college" are found in the cupboards. IPD case sheets of this Arpit Ayurveda hospital and college of Date of Admission-27/5/25 and Date of Discharge-11/06/2025 were found in the hospital. Admission and discharge register are improperly maintained.

- X ray machine is non functioning.
- General Physician, Gynecologist, Surgeon were absent on the day of virtual visitation.
- Paramedical and Nursing staff were lacking in IPD.

3. **Miscellaneous**

- NABH accreditation is not done.
  - Skill lab not functional.
  - Form 16 is not provided for the teaching staff.
  - One yoga instructor is not available.
  - Salary of teaching staff and non-teaching staff is not as per MES 2024.
  - College has not applied for NABL Accreditation for clinical laboratory.
4. Considering the above observations during inspection, virtual visitation and physical hearing MARBH has decided to issue **Permission to Arpit Homoeopathic Medical College, Rajkot-Morbi Highway, Hadala, Taluka; Tankara, District: Rajkot-360003, Gujarat for continuing BHMS course with intake capacity of 48 seats (reduced from 60 seats) for the academic year 2025-26.**
5. MARBH has decided to **issue denial of permission to Arpit Homoeopathic Medical College, Rajkot-Morbi Highway, Hadala, Taluka; Tankara, District: Rajkot-360003, Gujarat for increase of UG Seats from 60 to 100 seats for Academic year 2025-26.**
6. All admissions shall be made from NEET qualified candidates only. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 48 UG seats course shall be treated as All India Quota. Counseling for seats under all India quotas shall be conducted by respective Counseling Authority of State/UT govt as designated by Central Government and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned counseling authority of the state/UT.
7. The Category wise list of the selected candidates may be informed to the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Homoeopathy after the process of admission is completed. Any admissions carried out other than NEET qualified students will not be approved by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board.
8. **If the College is aggrieved by any decision of the Autonomous Board, college may prefer an appeal to the Commission against such decision within 30 days of the communication of such decision as per National Commission for Homoeopathy (Assessment and Rating of Medical Institutions) Regulations 2024, section 14 subsection (1)' and NCH General Regulation 2023 'section 22. The Manner of instructions for appeal are attached.**
